- Ron Bennett, the speaker at the October Advocacy Forum, presented information on the state of California's economy, school funding, Propositions 51 and 55, and parent engagement. He predicted Prop. 55, the tax extension, will pass, but Prop. 51, the school facilities bond, will not.

- Some of the bills that California State PTA supported and that were passed into law are listed on page 2 of the *Communicator*.
